



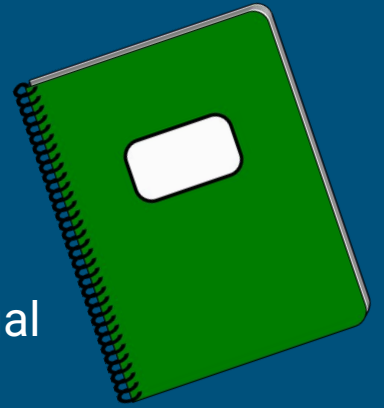

What is a journal?

- A law journal is a student-run organization that publishes legal scholarship
- Legal scholarship is often cited by judges in their published opinions
- All law schools have one (and often one law school has several!)

- *Sports and Entertainment Law Journal*
- *Law Journal for Social Justice*

Why join a journal?

- To sharpen your legal writing skills
- To become an expert at citations
- To improve your attention to detail & time management skills
- To network - build your resume & show off to potential employers
- Potentially publish your own work



How to join a journal:

- Complete the Write-On Exam in May 2025, after your spring semester finals
 - Closed-book & closed-universe exam consisting of two sections:
 - The Bluebook portion
 - The memo portion
- Submit any supplemental materials required by the journal you wish to join
- Work hard this year! Journals also consider 1L grades, with an emphasis on legal writing grades
